A GREAT BOOK TO READ

'Creating innovators—The Making of Young People who will Change the World' by Tony Wagner (2012)

We've all watched how focussed very young children can be when they play, especially when they are using their imaginations—those sparks of creativity are ones we need to nurture and support as our children and students grow.

"Play, passion and purpose: These are the forces that drive young innovators."

Through interviews with some very accomplished young people, and the key adults in their lives (parents, some educators & mentors), the author shares how adults can help children and youth to find their passion, to learn from failures (see them as 'iterations'), and to persevere through challenges.

He writes about how we can apply this knowledge as educators and parents, and gives examples of some of the most forward thinking schools, colleges and workplaces, where teachers and employers are developing cultures of innovation based on collaboration, interdisciplinary problem-solving and intrinsic motivation.

It is a stimulating book to read and has much to offer about what works best for engaging young people in their lifelong learning.
