HEALTH PROMOTION UNIT WANTS TO PARTNER WITH SCHOOL COUNCILS TO OFFER FOOD FAIRS FOR THE 2015/2016 SCHOOL YEAR



WHAT IS A FOOD FAIR?

A school event focused on celebrating healthy food while providing parents with opportunities to model healthy behaviors and get ideas for healthy lunches and snacks they can prepare at home. Children are able to experience food through a variety of fun ways and have the opportunity to prepare their own snacks.

WHAT DOES A PARTNERSHIP MEAN?

Your school council will provide volunteers; location; is responsible for “getting the word out” and advertising the event to parents, staff, and students; and purchasing food. Health Promotion Unit has a budget for this project and is also willing to loan you equipment you may not have (for example: blenders). You will work closely with the Community Dietitian throughout the planning stages, and the Dietitian will provide guidance and suggestions on types of foods to offer at your event, etc.

The sky is the limit for ideas!

Here is a 'new to us' scholarship opportunity that some of your students might want to learn about:

Horatio Alger Association of Canada

Every year, 80 need-based scholarships worth \$5,000 and another 5 worth \$10,000 will be awarded to full-time high school students in every province and territory. The scholarships are awarded to students who have demonstrated integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity, as well as strength of character, a good academic record, a commitment to pursue a post-secondary education, and a desire to contribute to society.

SCHOOL COUNCIL MEMBERS NEEDED FOR SCHOOL REVIEW TEAMS

This is a **CALL OUT** to those who would like to learn more about participating on a School Review Team. Reviews are part of the School Growth Planning process and take place once every 3 years in all Yukon schools. It is a most interesting and valuable experience with a very short time commitment (usually 2 or 3 days), and arrangements can be made for covering expenses.

Don't worry if you feel you might not have the needed skill or 'expertise' to fill this role—there will be good support and guidance from others, and the most important element you bring to the Team is your interest in learning more about what is happening in our schools that is affecting our children's learning.

The focus of each School Review Team is to provide recommendations, based on observations and discussions with the students, staff and the School Council, which are aimed at improving successful outcomes for students. You will not be on a Review Team for your own school as it is a view from 'outside' that is being sought.

It is very important that School Council members (both current or past), as well as other parents and community members are represented on each Team to ensure that the Team will be balanced in terms of having a variety of perspectives, experiences and groups involved.
