

As part of the Canada 150 Signature Project "2017 Voyageurs Rendezvous," which included a 1600 kilometre canoe race from Rocky Mountain House, Alberta to The Pas, Manitoba, the Confluence Heritage Society of Rocky Mountain House produced 6 instructional videos of approximately 15 minutes in length each, to be used by schools and educators across the country, free of charge. The videos were produced at Rocky Mountain House National Historic Site with the help of lifelong paddlers Jim and Doreen Guilloux.
